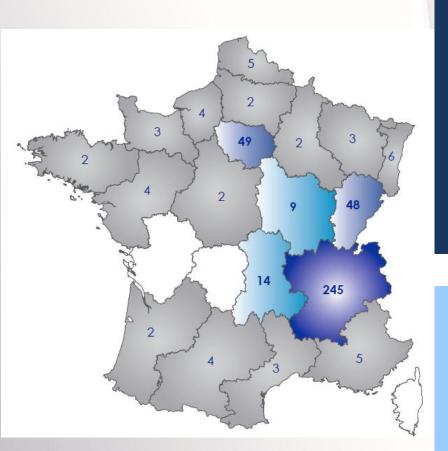

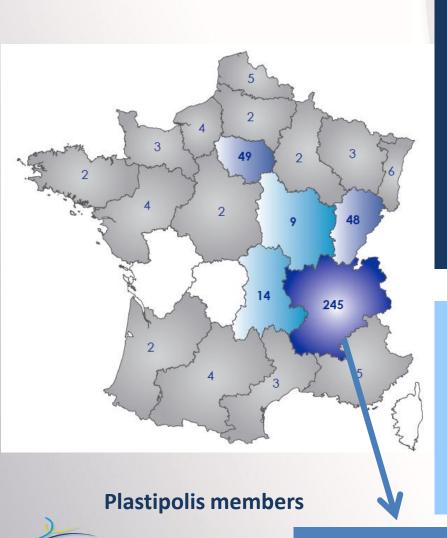

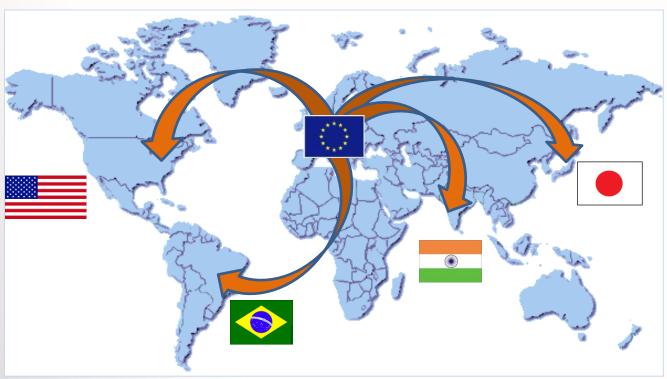

Next steps:

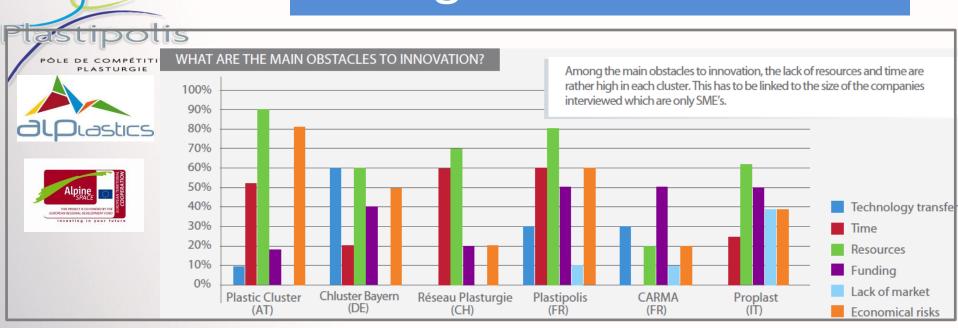
- Reinforced collaboration between the European clusters: shared activities, common actions in trade fairs, co-organization of events...

- Increasing <u>involvement of companies</u> European and international sides

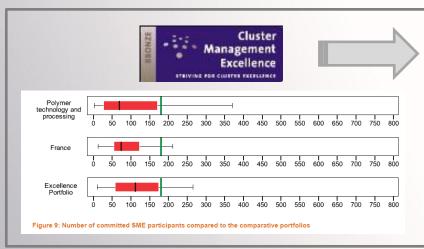
