



Chemical Clusters in Europe





ECRN as a Collaboration Platform

- Network of regional public authorities
- Current members: 19 chemical regions in Europe
- Acknowledged European chemical stakeholder
- Platform for collaboration: working together to maintain the competitiveness of the chemical industry in Europe
- Promoter of regional interests: articulating common interests towards the EU, fostering inter-regional exchange and cross-border cooperation
 - Secretariat in Brussels
 - Regular inter-regional meetings
 - Working Groups, Projects, Congresses...









Brief History of ECRN


- 2003: 1st Congress of European Chemical Regions
- 2004: ECRN started as an INTERREG IIIc project
- 2007: ECRN established as an association
- 2007-2009: ECRN in the European Commission's High Level Group (HLG) on the Competitiveness of the chemical industry in the EU
- 2008: ChemLog-project launched
- 2010: Losamedchem-project launched
- 2010: ChemClust-project launched
- 2012: 10th ECRN Congress







ECRN as a Project Platform



New initiatives:

- Continuation projects (preparation in Thematic Working Groups)
- Horizon 2020 and post-2013 EU programmes
- Exploring new areas of collaboration with partners (e.g. Knowledge Alliances)



How is ECRN organised?

- General Assembly overseeing network activities
- Executive Board chaired by Prof. Dr. Birgitta Wolff, Minister of Science and Economy of Saxony-Anhalt
- Permanent Working Group with representatives from the member regions' ministries and related institutions (exchange of experiences)
- Thematic Working Groups for special topics and closer collaboration
- Secretariat in Brussels responsible for day-to-day operations of the network and communication with members and stakeholders











How does ECRN work?

- Members meet regularly (meetings, events and activities): added value through exchange of experience and best practice, fostering crossborder collaboration
- Secretariat in Brussels facilitates interregional collaboration, engages in discussions at the EU level and represents the network at the European level
- Members are informed on EU matters via internal newsletters, contacts and knowledge within the network
- ECRN cooperates with other chemical stakeholders at regional and European level and engages with relevant partners e.g. by organising a high-level Congress annually









What does ECRN work on?

 Action plan shaped by members: The activities of the network mirror the needs and interests of the member regions



- At the moment, ECRN is for instance:
 - Working with the EU Commission (DG Enterprise) on a study analysing policies in chemical regions
 - Supporting activities related to REACH Review and 2013 registrations
 - Monitoring EU policies on Industrial Policy, Research and Innovation, Logistics and Transport, Energy, and Skills Development
 - Setting up new thematic working groups to prepare new European projects and further activities
 - Collaborating with partners (e.g. Cefic and EUCheMS)





Objectives of ECRN

- Fostering European cooperation of regional actors in the field of chemicals
- Improving regional development strategies in chemical regions
- Articulating the common interests of chemical regions towards the European institutions
- Ensuring recognition of the ECRN as a strong regional chemical stakeholder at the European level









ECRN & HLG Participation

- First regional network represented in a HLG
- Regional examples and ECRN activities featured in HLG discussions and the final report
- Mandate and organisation of the official HLG Follow-Up event in Usti/CZ
- Regional follow-up events organised in several ECRN member regions
- 8th Congress of the ECRN focused on HLG implementation







ECRN & the EU

- ECRN has good relations to the European Commission (DG Enterprise and Industry in particular) and the network is recognised as an important chemical stakeholder
- ECRN contributes to EU discussions through consultations, meetings with decision-makers and other stakeholders, participation at events and conferences etc.
- During 2012, the European Commission is carrying out a study to analyse the policies in chemical regions to support the competitiveness of the chemicals industry

 ECRN members are included in the study and the network is actively involved in the process
