

- Annual budget 1.7 Million € + other funding
- Supported by 5 ministries:
 - State Ministry
 - Ministry of Finance
 - Ministry of Economic Affairs, Labour and Housing
 - Ministry of Rural Affairs and Consumer Protection
 - Ministry of the Environment, Climate Protection and the Energy Sector
- Currently 23 employees + external freelancers



Policy framework and impulses for the transition to a bioeconomy

Baden-Württemberg

- In the South–West of Germany
- 11 Million Inhabitants (as of 2017)
- 45 % Agricultural land
- 39 % Forest area
- GDP: 511.4 Billion Euro (as of 2018)
- High–Tech location
- Many companies are global leaders
- Patchwork-like bioeconomic structure



Policy framework and impulses for the transition to a bioeconomy

• 2013 → 2020

Research Strategy with two funding periods of the research programme "Bioeconomy Baden-Württemberg" (2014–2018 & 2018–2020)

• $2017 \rightarrow 2018$

Participation process implemented to gather recommendations for action from relevant or interested bioeconomy actors (ca. 30 meetings, >300 participants)

• 04.06.2019








Identified routes for the utilization of the regional resources

- Mission oriented (technology open)
- More than substitution
- Smart management of natural and regional resources for energy and material use > Decentralisation (Bioeconomic Distributed Manufacturing Environments)
- Linking bioeconomy to circular-economy and sustainability
- Prioritisation of applications with higher economic, ecologic and social value potential
- Energetic use of biomass only after material use, if possible

Availability of skilled work force

School

- Specialised courses (e.g. Biotechnology)
- Education for Sustainable Development entered education programmes

Higher Education & Research

- Many research facilities covering Bioeconomy topics
- Master Degree Bioeconomy at the University of Hohenheim
- Foundation of the European Bioeconomy University in 2018 (Wageningen, Bologna, Eastern Finland, Hohenheim, BOKU Vienna, AgroParisTech)



Public funding and projects supported

- Research programme Bioeconomy (2014 2020):
 - 14 Million Euro
 - → Lignocellulose
 - → Biogas
 - → Microalgae



- Bioeconomy policy strategy (2020 2024):50 Million Euro
 - → Bioeconomy in state politics and administration
 - → Thematic areas: rural, urban and industrial areas
 - → Cross-cutting: cooperation between thematic areas, actors and clusters
 - qualification and advanced training programmes
 - Awarness building (information + dialogue)

Inter-regional/cross-border cooperation

- Policy Strategy:
 - "From research and innovation location to leading region"

Measure: "... and strengthen international cooperation..."

- "International Bioeconomy Congress BW"
- Inter-regional/cross-border cooperation based on individual engagement




Inter-regional/cross-border cooperation

→ Joint Biobased Cluster Policy Strategy






Public tools to boost market demand

- Not well developed
- No real market incentives

Example:

- Sustainable Energy Act (EEG) is running out
 - About 950 biogas plants need a subsequent strategy for use

- (Public) Awareness
- Investments: From Research to market
- Industry: Lack of critical mass of actors
- Supporting framework conditions: Missing market incentives
- Data: Lack of statistical data (NACE)
- Connecting rural and urban areas
- Digital tools
